



Educating Future Physicians

An exceptional commitment to the advancement of medical education has been a core St. Luke's focus since its inception in 1872. It is why St. Luke's partnered with the Lewis Katz School of Medicine at Temple University to develop the first and only medical school campus in the Lehigh Valley and why we are expanding our graduate medical education program.

More than 42,000 square feet of the new facility will be dedicated to expanding St. Luke's program for training future physicians. The new hospital building will house the Network's second graduate medical education program and include a study lounge, auditorium, café, conference and lecture rooms as well as simulation and exam labs. Because of this expansion, the number of residents will nearly double to more than 400 and the number of programs will increase from 28 to 35. New residency programs will include Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, Emergency Medicine, Neurology, Psychiatry, ENT and Dermatology. Over the next 5 years, St. Luke's Anderson Campus expects to train 160 residents, some of whom will care for our community for years to come.

A Message from our President

St. Luke's Anderson Campus has experienced tremendous growth over the past 7 years. Since opening, we increased the size of our emergency department and added a new medical/surgical floor to provide specialized care for oncology patients. Most recently, we opened a 75,000 square-foot Specialty Pavilion to house outpatient surgery and physician specialty practices.

As the demand for high-quality, low-cost health care continues, I am pleased to announce our latest expansion—the new Women & Babies Pavilion at St. Luke's Anderson Campus. The four-story, 180,000 square-foot facility was designed with the patient in mind. It will offer large rooms, private and quieter spaces for new families, and allow us to continue to meet the needs of the community. This expansion will nearly double the size of the hospital and will include:

- The opening of the third labor and delivery unit at St. Luke's
- A Level III neonatal intensive care unit (NICU)
- A 36-bed medical/surgical unit
- Space for the future expansion of our emergency department

One of the floors of the building will house 7 new graduate medical education programs. These residencies will complement our existing 28 longstanding programs offered at St. Luke's and will make us the largest residency training program in the Lehigh Valley.

We hope you share our excitement for all the positive changes in store for St. Luke's Anderson Campus. As we move into the next chapter of our hospital's and community's future, we hope you will continue to support our efforts to provide better access to care for our community.

Welcoming Babies for the First Time

The new Women & Babies Pavilion at Anderson Campus will serve as our third labor and delivery unit to accommodate the growing number of deliveries at St. Luke's. Last fiscal year, total deliveries in our Network grew by 9 percent. The new facility will feature large rooms and state-of-the-art technology and a top-level expertise medical team to provide the highest quality care to patients. Patient rooms will be warm and comforting, offering spectacular views and farm-fresh produce from the St. Luke's Rodale Institute Organic Farm. Special lighting and sound features, as well as the colors and textures of the rooms, will provide a home-like environment for our expectant mothers and their families.



For newborns who need extra care, the new facility will feature a Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), providing highly specialized care for birth of multiples, premature babies and full-term babies with medical problems. The NICU will include a family waiting room for visitors, a night watch room for parents to spend a night with their baby before going home and a private place to breastfeed or pump milk. Special lighting and noise control will create an environment that is sensitive to babies. The new NICU design will allow mothers to remain bedside and offer private rooms to accommodate premature infants.

Our 32-room postpartum unit and 16-bassinet nursery, as well as 18 semi-private NICU rooms will offer family-friendly spaces designed for comfort and convenience. These comprehensive obstetric services will enhance St. Luke's ability to provide convenient, easily accessible care for patients living in eastern Pennsylvania and western New Jersey.
