Fall & Spring Physician Assistant Observer Program

Program Overview

St. Luke's offers college students, who are at least rising juniors, an opportunity to apply for the Physician Assistant Observer Program. This program is designed to assist exemplary students in deciding if the Physician Assistant field is a fit for the student. Participants will have an opportunity to observe Physician Assistants at various locations within the Network, both inpatient and outpatient, in various specialties as well as the entire multidisciplinary healthcare team. The students are also encouraged to visit a number of diagnostic and treatment areas to understand the role they play in the patient's care.

The purpose of this program is not to accumulate observation hours, but to guide students in making a career choice. Those students strictly in need of direct patient contact hours can do so through a volunteer assignment. Program Requirements

Applicants must be of junior status with a 3.25 CUM to be considered. Please make sure your schedule will permit you to observe at least once a week in the morning from 7 - 11 and one afternoon a week. Students are required to attend Tuesday morning presentations (between 7:30-9am) and observe approximately 5-7 hours each week (minimum requirement) during the semester to achieve a minimum of 60 hours.

Applications for the fall program are due by July 1st, for the spring program by November 1st; **Spaces are limited and only complete application packages will be considered.**

- 1. Letter of intent (personal statement) addressing:
 - a. why you think you want to be a PA
 - b. previous experience that supports this decision(include number of observational hours already completed)
 - c. what interests you in healthcare
 - d. what you hope to gain from the experience
 - e. when you would like to participate
 - f. what your availability will be during the week/weekends
 - g. what extra-curricular activities do you actively participate in and when do they meet
 - h. how many credits/academic units you will have during this semester
- **2. Letters of recommendation** from your professional advisor and a professor in your major field (or suitable replacement) noting interpersonal skills and academic abilities.
- 3. Current resume
- 4. Official transcript
- **5. Availability** please include timeframes of four hours or greater during which you're available to observe between Monday Friday 7AM 5PM

*It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that items #2 & 4 are sent by the school representative to the Volunteer Services Office via the aforementioned address.
