A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



In early 2018, Blue Mountain Health System merged with St. Luke's University Health Network—a partnership formed to improve the healthcare landscape for Carbon County and neighboring residents. One of our first tasks was to evaluate the community's needs, and we learned that patients in our service area would benefit significantly from improved access to specialty care, chronic disease prevention resources, and mental and behavioral health services.

Since the merger, our network has made tremendous progress meeting these needs. We've invested millions into important projects such as renovating our Older Adult Behavioral Health Unit at St. Luke's Gnaden Huetten Campus, expanding specialty services in the area, and upgrading technology so patients can easily and securely access their health information.

In the coming months, we'll be investing another \$100 million to construct a new replacement hospital equipped with the latest technology so that patients have access to the best treatment options and care. This commitment will ensure comprehensive care close to home, which will significantly impact future economic growth and quality of life in Carbon County and surrounding areas.

The National Rural Health Organization presented St. Luke's with the 2018 Outstanding Rural Health Organization award, which recognizes our dedication to expanding and improving access to health care in Carbon County and other rural areas.

Our rural health centers handle thousands of patient visits annually, delivering high-quality primary care and community outreach programs at a lower cost, to benefit underserved populations.

With the recent addition of our rural Family Medicine Residency—which prepares the next generation of family physicians to practice in rural and underserved areas—we are making sure that all those who need high-quality care can get the services they need for decades to come.

TRANSFORMING CARE IN CARBON COUNTY

In addition to building the new hospital, St. Luke's is hard at work creating a healthier Carbon County, with the following enhancements underway.

New health center in Palmerton to provide easy access to urgent care, laboratory, and physician services—in addition to endocrinology and disease management services

Expanded transportation services that will help patients quickly and safely reach the care they need

Consolidation of all behavioral health services at the Gnaden Huetten campus to meet the growing need for quality mental health care

New partnerships and resources to address the significant increase in drug overdoses seen in our emergency department

A growing network of outpatient health care locations throughout the greater Carbon County region


