New Year's Eve 2020 was undoubtedly one of the most anticipated celebrations in recent memory as our region and the world breathed a collective sigh of relief and said goodbye to a challenging year.

Thankfully, we begin 2021 with renewed hope. Since December 18, St. Luke's has delivered more than 50,000 COVID-19 vaccines to our employees, community providers, first responders, and priority groups identified by our public health leaders.

Our goal is to make the vaccination process as easy and convenient as possible. There are currently 11 St. Luke's vaccination sites delivering up to 3,000 vaccines per day. More than 1,000 employees are assisting with the vaccination efforts. Their work is supported by state-of-the-art technology that has enabled St. Luke's to contact more than 700,000 people in recent weeks, helping them sign up for the vaccine as we wait for the supply to increase.

Yet even as we respond to the ongoing challenges presented by COVID-19, St. Luke's continues to forge ahead with new partnerships and facilities to enhance the care across our region.
