

2025 Network Community Health Needs Assessment Executive Summary

The Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) is conducted every three years as part of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. The established priority areas were determined based on CHNA findings and alignment with the social determinants of health, Healthy People 2030 objectives, and the mission and vision of St. Luke's University Health Network (Network).

Key Findings

Overall Network assessment results highlight three priority focus areas for our community health initiatives:



Access to Care



Chronic Disease Prevention



Mental and Behavioral Health

The priorities established serve as a guide for our health initiatives that support our patients, community health workers, and communities. Findings from the 2025 CHNA highlight the differences within our communities that contribute to the prevalence of disease and poor health outcomes that can lead to a lack of optimal health, especially among socially disadvantaged populations.



Prevention of Chronic Disease


- Of respondents ages 45 years and older, 83.4% reported having one or more chronic disease
- 18.7% of respondents with private health insurance did not have a routine colorectal cancer screening compared to 48.8% of respondents without insurance
- 13.2% of respondents did not have routine breast cancer screening compared to 39.3% of respondents without insurance
- 20.8% of respondents making less than \$15,000 annually reported having asthma compared to 8.8% making \$60,000 or more

Mental and Behavioral Health

- 38.6% of respondents reported one or more poor mental health days in the last 30 days
- 21.6% of respondents reported being emotionally abused by their partner or someone else important to them
- Suicide rates in Veteran populations in the United States increased 11.6% between 2020-2021 compared to a 4.5% increase for the general population
