

Mental and Behavioral Health







Prevention of Chronic Disease

•Of respondents ages 45 years and older, 78.4% reported having one or more chronic disease

- •17.2% of respondents with private health insurance did not have a routine colorectal cancer screening compared to 58.1% of respondents without insurance
- •12.2% of total respondents did not have routine breast cancer screening compared to 35.3% of respondents with Medicaid
- •10.9% of respondents making less than \$15,000 annually reported having asthma compared to 7.3% making \$60.000 or more



Mental and Behavioral Health

•41.8% of respondents reported one or more poor mental health days in the last 30 days

•22.3% of respondents reported being emotionally abused by their partner or someone else important to them

•Suicide rates in Veteran populations in the United States increased 11.6% between 2020-2021 compared to a 4.5% increase for the general population
