A Gift for the Community

St. Luke's Monroe Campus is doubling in size with the construction of a new tower, thanks in part to a generous \$250,000 grant from the Ann & Joseph Farda Family Foundation.

"The family felt it was important for Mom and Dad, through their charitable foundation, to be a part of the St. Luke's Monroe hospital campus expansion project. It was always their desire, and subsequently ours as well, to make Monroe County an extraordinary place to live, work, and raise a family," said Foundation spokesman Tony Farda.

The new tower will be home to a 36-bed general medical-surgical unit, operating and procedure space, expanded outpatient programs, and a state-of-the-art interventional radiology suite.

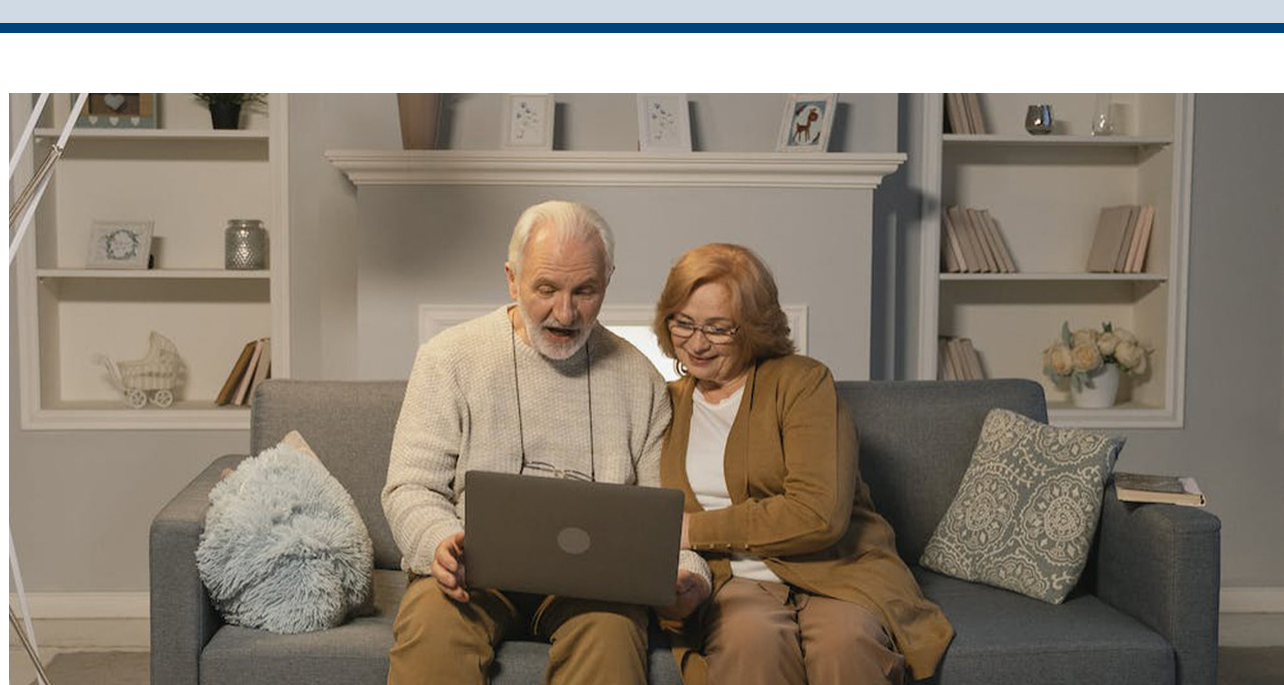


Be Patient, Be Kind, and Give Back

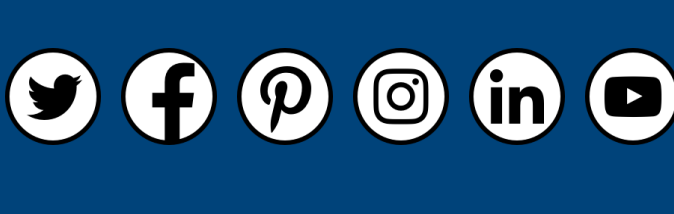
